The Barnstormers Will Present Annual PTHS Meeting March 11, 2018

An interesting program about the collecting of antique farm equipment is planned for the annual meeting of the Patterson Township Historical Society.

That meeting will be held at 2 p.m. on Sunday, March 11, at the society's Research Center at 110 N. El Circulo. The center is named in memory of the late Lt. Col. John V. Azevedo and officially opened early last year. All society members and others interested in this unique program are invited to attend.

Ken Herger, head of a newly formed group calling itself The Barnstormers and himself curator of farm equipment for the society, is in charge of the program. Ken has organized an energetic group of volunteers who have been working weekends on antique farm equipment, most lately at the Bettencourt equipment museum at the intersection of Highway 132



The Barnstormers, a group of antique farm equipment enthusiasts headed by Ken Herger, will present the program when the Patterson Township Historical Society holds its annual meeting on Sunday, March 11. The meeting will be held at the society's new Research Center at 110 N. El Circulo

and River Road. Photos of their extensive work will be presented at the meeting, after which refreshments will be served.

Assisting Herger with the program will be West Sider Henry Bettencourt. His father Eddie and uncle Frank Bettencourt came here to farm in the early 1960s, and it was Frank who founded the museum that houses several dozen pieces of antique equipment – much of which has been restored to running condition.

Ken said he will detail plans for future activities of The Barnstormers and will recognize key members.

History Day for Students Is March 17; Judges Sought

National History Day will be observed in Patterson on Saturday, March 17. The program is sponsored annually by the Patterson Unified School District and the Stanislaus County Office of Education.

Display and presentations will be held at the Creekside Middle School. Volunteers are needed to judge the entries of students from the fourth through the 12th grades in six different categories. Judges may select preferred categories and will work on panels of two or three others to interview students, provide feedback on projects, and select finalists according to the guidelines provided.

The categories are documentary, performance, exhibit, paper, website and poster. The later is open to fourth and fifth grade students, while the other five categories may be entered by those in the sixth through the 12th grades. Students may enter as individuals or as teams.

Registration and the training of judges will begin that day at 8:00 a.m., with a light breakfast being served. Student presentations will run from 9:45 a.m. to 1 p.m., with the scoring announced at 2 p.m.

State Museum Grant Moves to 2nd Stage

Word has been received that the city of Patterson's state grant application has moved on to its second stage of approval.

The application would provide funds for renovation of the Center Building, the historic structure that houses Patterson's museum. The city owns the building and would match the funds provided by the state through its CCHE Museum Grant Program.

A team of five state project employees visited Patterson on Feb. 26 to inspect the site and review the application data with the city and society members. Xavier Guluarte is heading the grant application process for the city, while society President Linda Briggs, museum Curator Carol Scoles, Director Vivian Ratliff and Ron Swift are representing PTHS.

The review by the state includes the areas of museum programing, audience and outreach, community involvement, partnerships and the cost estimate for the project.
